Program Coordinator

Common Threads connects kids to healthy food in the garden, in the kitchen, and at the table. We want kids to grow up making food choices that are good for their bodies, their communities, and the

environment. Founded in 2006 and based in Bellingham, Washington, Common Threads is a grassroots, 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that promotes a "seed to table" approach to food production, good nutrition, and environmental stewardship. Most of our programs take place on public school grounds, during the school day. Additionally, Common Threads runs after-school gardening and cooking programs and summer camps in our school gardens and at our urban farm site.

The program coordinator is responsible for the oversight of Common Threads' school, after-school, and summer food education programs - supervising and supporting a team of 6 AmeriCorps Food Educators and a growing number of program volunteers.

Responsibilities

- Work closely with the Common Threads Executive Director to recruit, train, and support a team of six AmeriCorps Food Educators
- Oversee day to day implementation of Common Threads' School-based, after-school and summer seed-to-table education programs
- Recruit, train, place, supervise, celebrate and log hours for program volunteers and interns
- Oversee accurate program data management and monitoring of outcomes
- Manage registration and parent communication for participants in after-school and summer programs
- Other duties as assigned
