



# **Cooking Day Camp Assistant**

Are you interested in gardening, cooking, and teaching kids?

If so, Common Threads' garden and day camp support roles may be a good fit for you!

#### Our ideal candidates will:

- Be curious, adaptable, responsible, and caring
- Be excited to engage with kids, and with food from seed to table (gardening and cooking)
- Demonstrate a willingness to serve flexibly as part of a team as well as a willingness to communicate promptly about scheduling, questions, problems, and challenges
- Contribute lived experience that helps diversify the perspectives represented on our team. People of color, transgender individuals, members of the LGBTQ community, people whose first language is one other than English, men, high school students, and people with lived experience of hunger and poverty are particularly encouraged to apply.

#### **Position responsibilities:**

- Attend training at the beginning of summer.
- Collaborate with Common Threads Seed to Table Educators to support summer day camp programs.
  Your responsibilities may include: supervising children and teaching them to use cooking tools safely
  and appropriately; teaching garden skills such as weeding, watering, planting and harvesting;
  engaging kids in conversation with kindness and positive attitude; leading games and activities for
  small groups of children; modeling and supporting emotional regulation skills; and helping children
  adhere to the expectations of safety, responsibility and respect for self and others.
- Typical days run from 8 am to 4 pm. The meeting place for carpool is Whatcom Middle School, but for some schools, meeting at the service site can be arranged with good prior communication.

#### Other requirements:

- Willing to have a Washington State Background check run (a criminal record is not necessarily disqualifying)
- Willing to wear a Common Threads T-shirt while serving
- Be a U.S. citizen in order to fulfill AmeriCorps requirements
- Fully vaccinated against COVID-19 or able to demonstrate a religious or medical exemption.

- Monthly stipend based on service term hours: A 100 hour term is approximately \$483.00/month (pre-tax) over 3 months (avg 8 hrs/week); a 300 hour term is approximately \$1419/month (pre-tax) over 3 months (avg 20 hrs/week)
- <u>Segal AmeriCorps Education Award</u> from the National Service Trust upon successful completion of service. Prorated based on service term hours.
- Student Loan forbearance on qualifying loans during the service term
- Basic Food Benefits eligibility
